<u>Description:</u> SKYWARN is a volunteer program with nearly 290,000 trained severe weather spotters. These volunteers help keep their local communities safe by providing timely and accurate reports of severe weather to the National Weather Service. SKYWARN spotters provide essential information for all types of weather hazards, the main responsibility of spotter is to identify and describe severe local storms.

Prerequisites: None

<u>Registration Instructions:</u> Visit the Tampa Bay Skywarn web page and schedule to attend any of the courses offered. Note that there are generally no classes offered during the hurricane season. When you complete a course, you will be issued a Skywarn certificate that will need to be renewed every 3 years by completing the course again.

Please remember to keep your certificate after successfully completing the course and update your Taskbook.

<u>Additional Related, Follow-up or Advanced Courses:</u> Comet MetEd offers additional courses related to meteorology, amateur radio, etc. that are free, but do require you to register to access and track your usage of their courses.
